If you have ever gotten a couple or more quotes on a project for your house, you know that the price for the same job can vary significantly. If you are knowledgeable about the job that needs to be done, then you can evaluate the bids accordingly. Imagine doing something like that for our church building. The size of the job would be so much bigger, the nature of the project would probably be more specialized, and the expense of it would likely be a lot more. If I were tasked with such a responsibility, I would be very uncomfortable. I do not have a background in construction. I would not know how to evaluate one bid against another, and I would not know (when the job was completed) if it was done properly. Add to that the sense of responsibility of using every dollar wisely because they came from your offerings, and I would be a nervous wreck. Thankfully, I don't have to do that but, praise God, someone can and does.

You may have noticed that on the southeast corner of our building there is some work being done.



Here is the backstory. The metal roof over our Worship Center is angled for drainage purposes. There is a large drain on the southeast corner that has not worked properly and, as a result, too much water has stayed in the ground

next to the outside walls, particularly along the halls that lead back to the choir room. This week, the dirt around those walls was dug out, sealant was applied to the blocks, drain tile was laid, and the drain on top of the roof was fixed. The work should be wrapped up tomorrow or Friday.

You probably did not know that there was a problem. I didn't either, but someone did and they did something about it. I am so grateful for those "someones" because it is a great example of how different people serve behind the scenes to take care of things.

While the Elders are charged with the care and oversight of the members and give attention to the doctrine, discipleship, and direction of the church, others serve in important support roles. For example, the Finance Team not only oversees the finances, they oversee the building and grounds. When they put an annual budget together, they include costs for repairs. When this particular problem with the water became noticed, they investigated it, determined a game plan, got bids, and gave the go-ahead to do the project since the cost of it was within what our budget had for building repairs. Then, a member of the Finance Team came out and watched the work being done to make sure that we were getting the job we were promised at the price we were promised.

Members, we are well-served by our brothers and sisters who care about these details and do what they can to ensure that things are done properly. I am grateful that I am not expected to be an expert in waterproofing block and drain tile. So, kudos to the Finance Team for their planning and diligence. Things that we CAN see function better when the things that we generally don't see are being attended to. That's true about life too.
