Sermon Text: Luke 21:5-9

Follow-Up

Last Sunday's Sermon (Luke 21:1-4) focused on the widow's gift as an expression of her dependency on God.

Pass this along for personal reflection or use it for group discussion:

- Last small group the following question was posed: *Are there areas in your life where you are struggling to depend on God or to have "faith-driven" obedience?* Do you remember what areas you identified? Reflect on your week: In what ways did you seek to depend on the Lord in those areas? What might it look like to continue to depend upon him? How might your small group be of help to you?

Sermon Discussion

- Read Luke 21:5-9 together as a group.
 - Try to summarize the text and sermon in a couple of sentences as a group.
 - Review the main points of the sermon together.
1. What is something that encouraged your faith from the text/sermon or deepened your understanding about the character of God?
 2. The first point of the sermon dealt with being captured by the world's brilliance. What is it about the world's brilliance that can be so enticing?
 3. The second point of the sermon pointed out that *there will always be pretend saviors that threaten to mislead you*. What are some of the "pretend saviors" that our world might hold out to us? What do they promise? How does Jesus ultimately deliver on the promises "pretend saviors" cannot ultimately deliver on?
 4. The sermon highlighted that the lord is working in the chaos that scares you. In what ways have you experienced that personally in your life? How might this truth guide and direct the church in uncertain times? Are there any situations in your life right now that are marked by chaos and scare you? How can you group pray for you in those?

Small Group Prayer Points

- Spend time praising the Lord for specific examples shared in the first question.
- Spend time asking the Lord for wisdom and discernment as we live in a world full of pretend saviors that would seek to mislead us.
- Pray for any specific areas group members shared in question 4.
